From the Pastor The Parallax Effect

The first time in my life that I really began digging down into the Bible was when I was in college. My roommate at Rice



was a hardcore fundamentalist who knew the Bible incredibly well. In fact, he had spent time memorizing whole books of the Bible, which meant whenever we would get into any kind of discussion around religion, he was often quoting scripture at me. This put me at a severe disadvantage, because at the

time, I didn't know anything about the Bible. He had all this ammunition to prove his points and I had nothing.

Wanting to keep up in our discussions, I enrolled in a religious studies class, hoping to learn more about the

Bible. I distinctly remember the first day of class. The professor was setting the ground rules for class discussions. He made it clear to us that this was not a class where we were going to debate scripture. The reason why, he said, is because, if you know the Bible well enough, then you can support just about anything you want to believe.

This was news to me. Based on my interactions with my roommate, I thought there was only one way you could interpret the Bible and that one way often

included me being very wrong. However, as I began studying the scriptures, I discovered that my professor was correct. Depending on what you want to prove, you can justify almost any behavior or belief using the Bible.

This fall we are doing a sermon series that will demonstrate this exact point. The sermon series is called *Parallax*. A parallax comes from the Greek term parallaxis,

which means alteration. The parallax effect is when the same object appears to differ in terms of position or direction when viewed from different positions.

For instance, you and I can be standing in a field watching the sun set next to a tree. However, depending on where you're standing that sunset can look very different. If you're on one side of the field, it can look as though the sun is setting to the right side of the tree. If you're on the other side of the field, it can look as though the sun is setting to the left side of the tree. It's the same sunset, but we're seeing it from completely different perspectives.

So a parallax is when two people are looking at the exact same thing, but seeing it in completely different ways. The goal of this series is to explore how this is true of the Bible. Two different people can read the scripture and walk away

with completely different interpretations of what those verses mean.

For this series, there will always be two pastors preaching about the same topic. I will always take one side and TC or Judy will take the other. Each pastor is providing a different interpretation of the same topic. We will preach in a point-counterpoint fashion, so you will have the opportunity to decide who is more convincing.

What's more, the topics we will be addressing range from personally challenging to controversial. We'll be talking about

forgiveness, women in ministry, justice in the afterlife, the divine nature of scripture and much more. This will be a fun series that should provide some good food for thought. My hope is that the more we appreciate the wide breadth of scripture, the more we will realize that our faith really does encompass all aspects of the human experience.

Dominican Republic Mission 40 years of pride and partnership

In 1978, Tony Campolo, a representative from the Chicago Presbytery, spoke to the First Presbyterian Church of Arlington Heights on the importance of Mission Outreach. A group of singles in their 20's and 30's in the church took up his challenge and began to discuss an international mission. Al Timm, the associate minister of the church, was to be the designated pastor for the first trip. Sharon Wright Tackaberry was commissioned by the Session in 1978 to investigate possible sites for mission in the DR. She selected

Sanchez, a small village in the Dominican Republic for the first mission trip to go in 1979. She led the mission for several years with Rev. Leon Haring taking over as the pastor liaison for the second trip in 1980.

The Young Adult group at First Pres were the primary members involved with the mission. They were volunteers and conducted fundraisers at the beginning until the church became fully involved. The team decided the focus of the mission should be fellowship, Christian Education, health,

women's crafts (a sewing team) and minor church repairs. Anything that was broken, would be fixed and anything that needed painting, would be painted. The team brought all the necessary tools and supplies with them on each trip to insure the success of the mission.

The mission continued to go to Sanchez for 20 years. Pastor Jeff Deardorff, who joined the church and the mission in 1987, decided to move the mission in 1999 to Gaspar Hernandez where he had met Pastor Osvaldo Volario and was excited by the Pastor's vision and the opportunity for Christian growth in his community. Pastor Jeff's philosophy was to have a lasting mission, and it would be based on a partnership between our church and Pastor Osvaldo's church. Pastor Osvaldo agreed and the foundation was set.

This year, we celebrate 20 years of mission partnership with Pastor Osvaldo and the 40th anniversary with a mission to the Dominican Republic. During this time, over 250 different individuals from First Presbyterian Church of Arlington Heights have made trips to the DR and many more have prayed, purchased, packed school supplies, donated off the shelf medical supplies and equipment all to be hand carried in the team's luggage. These materials were

used by the team during our stay or left at the church. Over the years, Pastor Osvaldo's teams observed and learned from us and in many cases, improved the mission by taking it to outlying villages, often near the Haitian border.

The mission in Gaspar Hernandez kept the same basic teams as we had in Sanchez and we added more as the needs of the church were better understood. New church construction was a priority for Pastor Osvaldo. We formed a partnership with a group of men from the United Methodist

Church in Maryville, Tennessee, who liked to build things, churches in particular. Together, the men from the United Methodist Church and our own mission team, along with labor provided from Pastor Osvaldo's congregation, built four churches in barrios around Gaspar Hernandez to support Pastor Osvaldo's growing Christian community. Our last construction project, and the largest, was a church in the village of Villa Magante that has become the Manse for Pastor and his wife Rosa.

Over the years, our mission has:

- · Established an ESL program with donated books
- Developed health teams that now hold clinics and do their own clinic missions
- Set up Christian Education evolving to Summer Bible School programs
- Set up and supported craft teams for the women of the congregation
- Set up a clean drinking water program that has evolved to reverse osmosis equipment being furnished from Living Waters of the World and now managed

and maintained by some of the Pastor's scholarship students

Scholarships for Students

Our main focus today is continuing to support a scholarship program that was started in 2004. The program enables people from poor church families to finish high school and go to college if they qualify. The program is personally monitored by Pastor Osvaldo who reviews the progress of each student on a regular timetable. This year we will graduate eleven students in education, two in math, two in computer science and one in accounting. We also have one young lady who is in her final year in dentistry and one in her third year in nursing. This is the greatest number of students we have graduated in a single year! For years we had to look hard to find boys

graduating in the program. This year we have three. One is Joelki Guzman, who will graduate with a degree in math. He is an inspiration to all of us that we are doing the right thing in sponsoring this program. Congratulations to everyone and to Pastor Osvaldo for a wonderful year.

Over the years, this mission has involved hundreds of our own people who have taken personal vacation time and have spent their own money to become missionaries for our church. For many of them, it was a life changing experience but for all, it is an experience that they have not forgotten. The DR mission teams, with the prayers and financial support from our church, has made a major difference in the lives of the Sanchez and Gaspar Hernandez communities. We can be very proud of what has been accomplished in the past 40 years.

We are planning a mission for January 2020 and will be collecting materials for Bible School and for off the shelf medical supplies and over the counter medicines for the ongoing clinics. We will advise everyone when these items will be collected in the blue container in the Narthex. Session Highlights July and August meetings

From the July 8, 2019 Meeting:

- Session gave approval for a multi-generational Visioning Team of six, led by Mario Alberico, to proceed with the "Visioning Process" for our church. The purpose of this process is to establish the vision of the church and develop a plan for implementing it. The Visioning Team will report back to Session periodically for additional discussion and authorization.
- The Administration and Finance Committee reported that expenses are running in line with the budget, and the year looks to be shaping up well.
- Session approved the following members of the Capital Campaign Committee: Mike Noble (Chair), Kristen Aldrich, Garett Childs, Kris Ford, Tom Krigas, Jim Mayer, Kris Ward and Alex Lang (ex-officio).
- The Congregational and Community Life Committee offered thanks to the more than 60 congregation members who attended the recent "Feed My Starving Children" event.
- First Pres will have a booth open from 4:00-9:00 p.m. during the "Mane Event", which will take place on Friday, August 2. Free pop sockets and information about our congregation will be given to people stopping at the booth.
- The Mission Committee reported that our first-time collection of items for the group, "Veterans Exiting Homelessness," which ran from Memorial Day to the Fourth of July, was very successful. Of special note was that people from the community dropped off items plus \$150 during the Arlington Heights Fourth of July Parade. Thank you to all who participated in this worthwhile drive.
- WINGS requested 120 pairs of shoes, the highest number ever, for the Shoe Drive, scheduled to run from June 23-July 14.
- The Mission Committee is reading a book called Evicted, as part of this year's theme of "Homelessness."
 The book follows eight families, all of whom live in the Milwaukee, Wisconsin area, through their experiences with homelessness.
- Children's Ministries reported that Vacation Bible School began with 150 children in attendance, 60 of whom are rising fifth and sixth graders participating in "Mission Factory."
- Youth Ministries reported that the recent Silent Auction raised over \$7,800 for youth mission activities.

From the August 12, 2019 Meeting:

- TC reported that both the Middle School Mission
 Trip to the Quad Cities and the High School Trip to
 Montreat went well. In addition, Vacation Bible School was well attended.
- Fellowship Hall was flooded again during a heavy rain.
 The original carpet, which was installed in 1994, will be replaced with donated tile.
- Session gave approval for the purchase of the Schulmerich Classic Plus carillon system from the Verdin Company of Cincinnati, Ohio, with Music Endowment funds and donations. The new carillon will replace the exact functionality that we have now. The original carillon was purchased 35 years ago.
- The Congregational and Community Life Committee reported a very good turnout at our booth during the Mane Event in downtown Arlington Heights. They gave away 250 shopping bags with informational brochures about our church, pop sockets for phones and additional items from Vacation Bible School.
- Tickets for the Fall Kick-Off will be sold in the Narthex on August 25, September 1 & September 8.
- The Mission Committee reported that the collection for "Veterans Exiting Homelessness" officially ran from Memorial Day to the 4th of July. However, they continue to receive donations from both our congregation and the community. So far, \$250 has been collected and various household items, cleaning supplies and personal hygiene items with an estimated value of \$3,390 have been donated.
- The Mission Committee reported that we were able to fulfill WINGS' request for 120 pairs of shoes this year. Initially, when the drive was ended, we were short around \$125. However, our congregation donated additional funds that enabled the purchase of the remaining shoes. Many thanks to our congregation!





For thirty years, First Pres has been ministering to the

homeless in our community by serving as a PADS site. Every Tuesday evening, from October to April, we open our doors to about 30 guests. We provide a hot supper, a place to sleep, breakfast, and a sack lunch. We also provide a safe place out of the elements for folks to get a good night's rest, watch a little television, and relax for just a little while.

Over the years the face of homelessness in the Northwest Suburbs has changed. Initially, we provided safe sleeping space and hot food to men. Now the face of

homelessness includes women and families. We have worked hard to improve our space to accommodate these changes. However, with more volunteers we can make even more improvements and be a warm and welcoming space on a cold winter night.

We need you!! If you haven't participated in our PADS program in the past, please stop by a table in our lobby area on September 8, 15, or 22 to learn more

Even if you are willing to take one shift on one Tuesday night we welcome your participation. Every little bit helps us continue to run this program in connection with Journeys: The Road Home.
